Coronavirus update

Earlier this week I sent all parents an update from the Government about Coronavirus Covid 19.

I will continue to keep parents informed of the latest Government advice particularly if there are any changes.

Taking basic hygiene precautions remains the best way to reduce the chances of spreading the virus. Assemblies and form time have been used to remind the students of the Public Health England guidance: to wash their hands frequently and for at least 20 seconds each time, and to sneeze or cough into a tissue and immediately bin it.

We have clear and simple posters throughout the school reinforcing this message.

Hand sanitiser has been provided at Student Services for the students, at reception for visitors and in the staff room for staff. However, the guidance is clear that hand sanitiser is not a replacement for handwashing.

We are continuing to ensure the school is clean and safe and have added in daily cleaning of areas that people touch regularly such as handles and stair rails in the school with a disease control surface disinfectant.

At school, we have reminded pupils of the importance of handwashing and the key message of "Catch it, Bin it, Kill it".

We have displayed posters around the school and I will remind pupils again in assemblies next week. However, I would be grateful if parents could once again the stress the key messages to your sons/ daughters.

I would also be grateful if parents could inform Matron if their son or daughter displays any flu like symptoms as we are recording and monitoring all cases.

At present all school activities and events, including trips, are proceeding as normal. We will notify parents of any changes to our plans at our earliest opportunity.

Year 11 Algebra Award Results

I would like to congratulate the 122 students who sat the Edexcel Award in Algebra exam in January. I am delighted to report that 85% students achieved a pass on this paper, which focuses on core algebra skills necessary for success at GCSE. The students have received a mixture of Level 3 (AS equivalent) and Level 2 (GCSE equivalent) certificates depending on the level they sat. I am immensely proud of the hard work put in by these students and am looking forward to seeing the GCSE results from these students in the summer.

Outstanding Performance in English Spoken Language Endorsement

As part of their GCSE English examination Year 11 pupils took their English Spoken Language endorsement on Wednesday. All pupils presented a speech on a chosen topic and then responded to questions from staff and other pupils. The students rose to the challenge and delivered high quality presentations demonstrating just how confident and articulate our boys can be. The results will form part of their GCSE award in the summer and it is safe to say that the vast majority excelled in this element of their English Language course.



What a fantastic day for Verulam – Wednesday 4th March was the third curriculum enrichment day of the academic year.


Year 7 had an action packed day competing and engaging in House Sport, getting involved in many sports in the Sports Hall, Clarence Park and Sandpit Lane.
