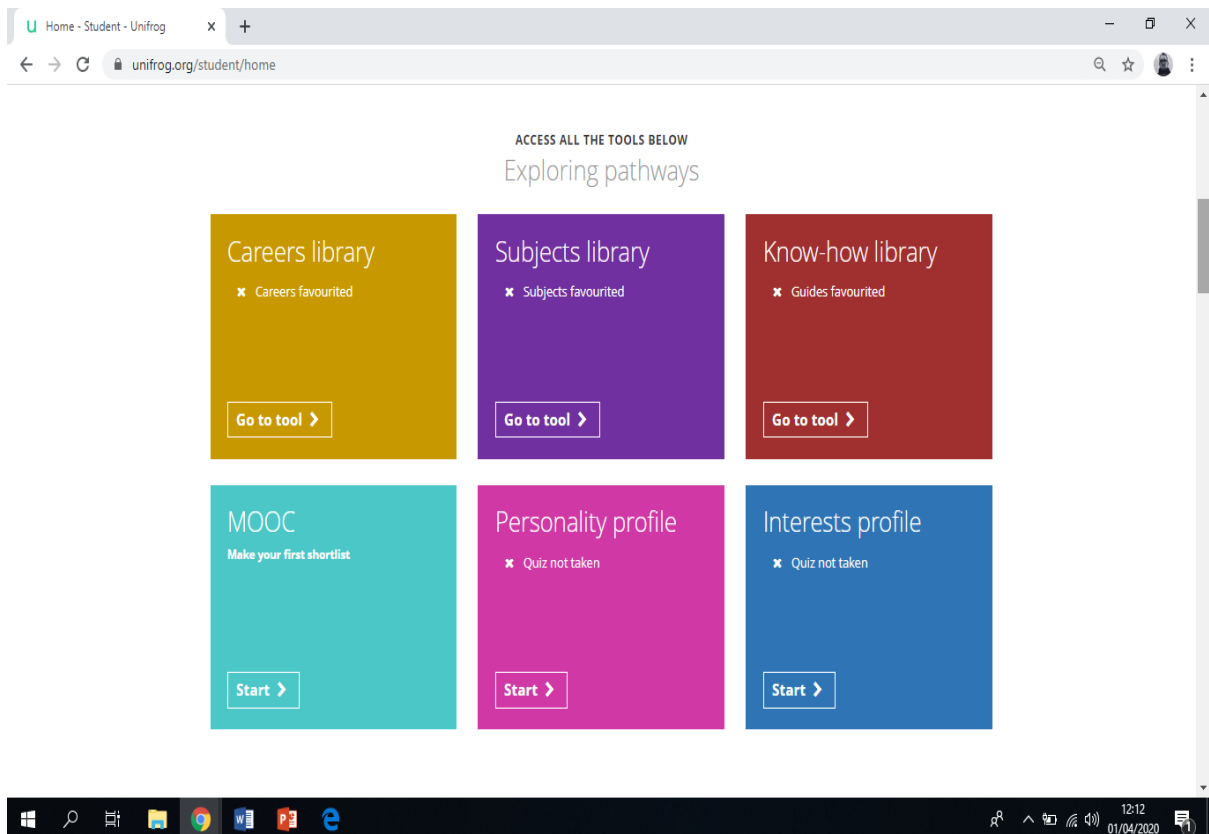

What are MOOC's?

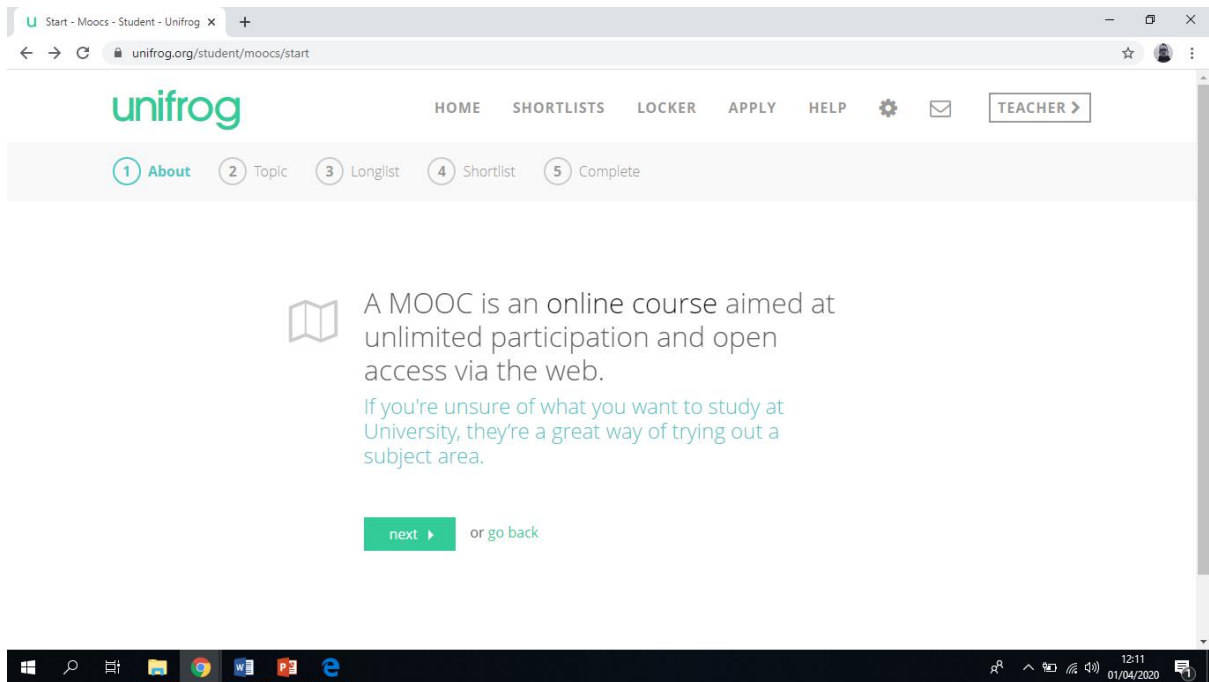

In addition to traditional course materials, such as filmed lectures, readings, and problem sets, many MOOCs provide interactive courses with user forums or social media discussions to support community interactions among students, professors, as well as immediate feedback to quick quizzes and assignments.



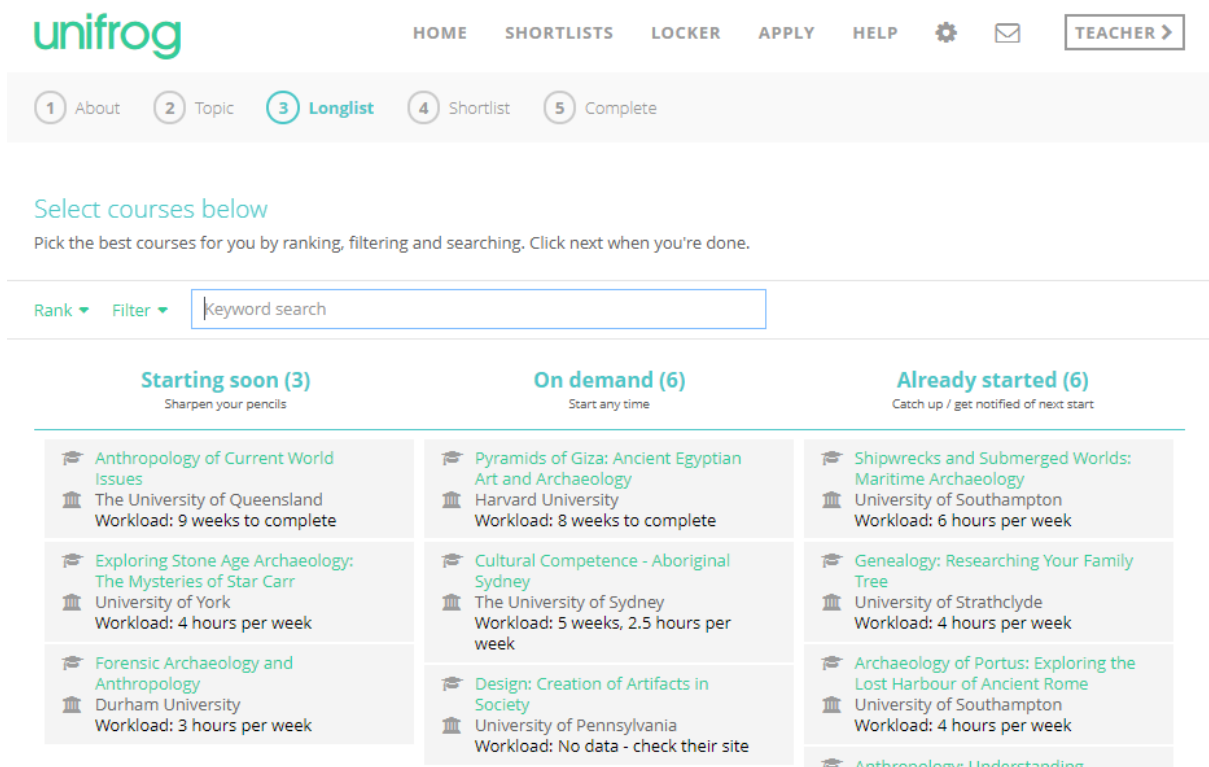
