## **Re-opening of School for Years 10 and 12**

We are very pleased to welcome back our Year 10 and 12 students to school next week and have written to parents giving full details of the partial re-opening. Safety of staff and students is of paramount importance and so I would like to ask parents to discuss this with their son or daughter over the weekend. Of particular importance is that:

- All students observe social distancing at all times and remain in their designated groups
- Entry to the school will be via Jennings Road for Year 10 and Brampton Road for Year 12
- Students should only bring in the requested equipment to school
- Students should not gather or socialise on the way to or from school
- All students should wash their hands on entering the site and before eating
- I would also be grateful if parents could ensure that their son or daughter only attends school if they are healthy and not showing any of the Covid-19 symptoms.

I would also be grateful if parents did not enter the site without an appointment.

## **Important Choices for Year 13**

The deadline for accepting university offers on the 18th June is fast approaching. Any student who would benefit from further guidance should contact Mr Base, Head of Sixth Form, as soon as possible. I am pleased that the vast majority of Year 13 have secured firm and insurance offers for courses of their choice. However, the changes brought about to higher education due to the pandemic will undoubtedly be a topic for discussion in many households.

## **Google Meets**

All Google meets are now confirmed for different subjects. If a meeting is not on the schedule then teachers will be using alternative means to communicate with their students.

- To access the Google Meets students should go to <u>meet.google.com</u> and click 'join a meeting.'
- They should then enter the code for the meeting they wish to enter. Please note each subject will have a different code, this allows meetings to start on schedule should any overrun.
- The meetings are only accessible to people using an @verulamschool.co.uk email address. This is the same one your son will have used for Google Classroom or Google Drive. If they are not logged in with the correct email address they can not access the Google Meets.
- Students are only able to join a meeting using the code once the teacher leading the Google Meet has started the meeting. Please be patient and stick to the schedule for access.
- If your son has not got an @verulamschool.co.uk email address or is having issues, please email <a href="loginqueries@verulamschool.co.uk">loginqueries@verulamschool.co.uk</a>

The schedule for Year 7-10 with codes is being sent via ParentMail today. The code will be the same for their meetings week to week so a new schedule will not be sent unless changes are necessary. Students in Year 12 will be sent codes directly from their teachers.

#### **Projects Years 7-9**

All projects are now available for students in Years 7-9. These can be accessed from the our website by clicking on the 'Home Learning' link from the home page or clicking <u>here</u>.

Students should be aiming to complete at least 1 hour of their project for each topic every week. This is in addition to their assessments which will also begin this week. A suggested timetable is provided for your son to manage their time.

All projects are to be submitted via email as an attachment. Email addresses for submission are included with each project, they all follow the same format, simply change the subject name and follow: SUBJECTproject@verulam.herts.sch.uk

Students should submit their work via email using the following format in the 'subject line' Name – Subject – Year Group i.e John Smith – Art – Year 7

Please remember that the weekly Google Meets are an opportunity for your son to seek any further guidance for their project and assessments.

If your son has completed their project work and assessments for the week then we recommend:

- They complete any outstanding tasks on Show My Homework or Google Classroom
- Revise for upcoming assessments
- Access the Oak National Academy Resources which can be found <u>here</u> or
- BBC Bitesize which can be found <u>here</u>.

- Students should upload their assessments to Show My Homework using the upload option.
- If your son is having any issues uploading their assessments then please email them to the member of staff who has set the assessment on Show My Homework, clearly indicating their name and year group in the email subject line.

- Sandringham assessments are live assessments with a 2 hour window for completion.
- Unless otherwise indicated, students should be aiming to write responses by hand and upload a photo or scan of their work for submission. This is to give students the experience of writing at length as they will be required to do during their final exams.
- Students should be aiming to complete the assessment without any other resources available to make the assessment a fair reflection of their learning.
