Her TED talk has received over 2 million views. A reporter for Nature since 2001, Pearson has won accolades including the Wistar Institute Science Journalism Award and two best feature awards from the Association of British Science Writers.

Pearson has a degree in natural sciences from the University of Cambridge and a PhD in genetics. She is working on her second book, What to Believe, which is about the use of research and evidence to make decisions.

DAISY COOPER MP

> Daisy was elected MP for St Albans in the 2019 General Election. Prior to Parliament she used to work for the cross-party movement More United.

As Campaigns Director, she designed and delivered campaigns that changed government policy four times. Previously, she worked in Commonwealth affairs for 10 years - campaigning for improved LGBT+ rights abroad and against human rights violations in Zimbabwe and Sri Lanka, and with victims of press abuse at Hacked Off. Daisy has campaigned alongside the "Save St Albans Pubs" campaign for two and a half years, successfully changing Liberal Democrat party policy to abolish the out-dated business rates system which is killing our high streets and replace it with a fairer tax.
