### A. Bursary Fund for Vulnerable Students

A bursary of up to £1,200 a year is available through application only for young people in the defined vulnerable groups listed below (with the actual amount dependent on the specific financial needs they have):

- In Care
- Care Leaver
- A student is in receipt of Income Support or in receipt of Universal Credit
- A student is in receipt of Employment Support Allowance (ESA) and Disability Living Allowance (DLA) or in receipt of ESA and Personal Independence Payment

To enable you to apply for the Vulnerable Bursary a funding claim form needs to be completed by the school for submission to the EFA and evidence of eligibility from the checklist below will be required.

#### Eligibility Checklist

- Copy of student Benefits Received/P60
- Tax Credit Award Notice or evidence of self-employment income
- No unauthorised or unexplained absence (the Headteacher will sanction what is unauthorised or unexplained).
- A standard of behaviour consistent with your Home School Agreement

A percentage of the above Bursary Award may be used by the school to purchase “in kind” items needed for course related costs such as transport pass, field trips, books.

### B. Discretionary Awards

All decisions about which students receive a discretionary bursary and how much bursary they receive, will be based on each student’s individual circumstances and their actual financial need.

#### Discretionary Award Level 1

This will be issued to students in ways that best fit their needs and circumstances for example those in receipt of free school meals or other exceptional circumstances such as where a young person is providing care to a sick or disabled relative.

### **Eligibility Checklist**

- Free School Meals
- Family in receipt of benefits or Tax Credit (evidence must be provided)
- No unauthorised or unexplained absence (the Headteacher will sanction what is unauthorised or unexplained).
- A standard of behaviour consistent with your Home School Agreement

### **Discretionary Award Level 2**

#### **Eligibility**

- Those who do not qualify for a Discretionary Award Level 1 but have an identifiable financial need (supporting documentation will be required)
- 100% attendance at school (no unauthorised or unexplained absence)
- A standard of behaviour consistent with your Home School Agreement

### **The Process**

You should apply for a Bursary or Discretionary payment as soon as possible. The deadline for Autumn Term Applications is Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> September 2023.

Please note all approved funding will be reviewed for eligibility on a termly basis.
