CHRISTOPHER HOPE

Christopher Hope is a British journalist. He is The Daily Telegraph's associate editor.

Hope formerly worked for PrintWeek, Construction News, The Scotsman and The Herald.

In 2001 Hope helped found a daily financial newspaper in Scotland, Business AM, which folded the following year. He was hired by The Daily Telegraph's City editor Neil Collins in 2003 to be part of its business team, in which he was business correspondent and industry editor.

In 2008 he was promoted from home affairs editor to Whitehall editor, thus entering the politics team, and subsequently moved to the role of senior political correspondent. He was part of the team of Daily Telegraph journalists that broke the news of the parliamentary expenses scandal.

Hope co-wrote the book Conundrum with Richard Bacon, a detailed account of the failings of UK public sector and government projects



To mark National Holocaust Day 2023 Vera will tell the moving story of her mother Alice Svarin. Part of Vera's testimony was recorded for Stephen Spielberg's Survivors of the Shoah Visual History Foundation.

Alice Svarin, was born in a market town in central Slovakia, under the Lower Tatras mountains in 1921. After a peaceful 18 years in a traditionally Jewish family, she married a local admirer in the spring of 1941. The marriage unwittingly saved her from being deported to Auschwitz with the 1000 single women from Slovakia.

The presentation includes photographs, maps and video clips of Alice telling the stories joined by a narrative by Vera. This is ultimately an optimistic story of a courageous no-nonsense woman who was able to adapt to changing circumstances despite the many challenges she faced.



Verulam Alumni

Cameron was a Verulam student between 2002-2009 going on to study Environmental Geography at the University of York.

In addition to studies, I participated in a wider range of activities – from university rugby to a fashion/dance show! After graduating, I completed a nuclear science and engineering graduate scheme with EDF Energy, traveling around the UK's nuclear power stations. I then joined an engineering consultancy (Amec Foster Wheeler) focusing on building the next generation of both civil and defence nuclear facilities. In 2016 I joined a management consultancy firm, PA Consulting, where I conducted business transformation across a range of defence and security-focused programmes within UK Government – from submarine & ship procurement to counterterrorism projects post-2017 attacks. Most recently I have joined a growing Silicon Valley tech and data firm - Palantir - which has included working with the NHS on its COVID response. Outside of work I am recently married and we now live in Harpenden with our 2-yearold dog - Ralph!



ESME STANTON-HOWE

Herts & Middlesex Wildlife Trust

Esme grew up in Watford and studied Ecology, Conservation and Environment at the University of Sussex and is a Wilder Communities Officer for Herts & Middlesex Wildlife Trust.

In her role she works to connect people with nature and wildlife. She liaises with a wide variety of organisations from schools and colleges to community groups and other charities, particularly in St Albans and Watford supporting their efforts to be more sustainable and engage with nature.

Daisy Cooper entered Parliament as MP for St Albans in the 2019 General Election, bucking the national trend by unseating the Conservative's Anne Main. Previously, she worked in international development for ten years, including eight years in Commonwealth affairs advising Ministers and international Commissions as an international civil servant and as an outspoken Director of a human rights think-tank.

She holds an LLM in Public International Law from Nottingham University, an LLB Hons in Law from Leeds University, a Foundation Certificate in Psychotherapy and Counselling and is also an SPC Accredited Mediator

Peter Tatchell is a British human rights campaigner, originally from Australia, best known for his work with LGBT social movements.

Tatchell was selected as the Labour Party's parliamentary candidate for Bermondsey in 1981. He was then denounced by party leader Michael Foot for allegedly supporting extra-parliamentary action against the Thatcher government. Labour subsequently allowed him to stand in the Bermondsey by-election in February 1983. In the 1990s he campaigned for LGBT rights through the direct action group OutRage!, which he co-founded. He has worked on various campaigns, such as Stop Murder Music against music lyrics allegedly inciting violence against LGBT people and writes and broadcasts on various human rights and social justice issues.
