Paper 4: Coursework: Independent Investigation Evidence independent analysis and evaluation of data and presentation of data findings.

HOW WILL YOU BE ASSESSED?

Paper 1 Written examination: 2 hours 15 mins 30% of the qualification

Paper 2 Written examination: 2 hours 15 mins 30% of the qualification

Paper 3 Written examination: 1 hour and 45 minutes 20% of the qualification

Assessment overview

An externally-assessed written examination, with use of a resource booklet.

Paper 4 Coursework: Independent Investigation Non-examined assessment 20% of the qualification

The student creates a question for investigation, either human, physical fieldwork.
